Biggio to Make Guest Appearance at Elementary School Wednesday Morning

WHAT: The Houston Astros 2010 Caravan continues with several stops in League City and Clear Lake on

Wednesday. The first stop will be at Ross Elementary School where Astros personnel, including former Astros great Craig Biggio, will host a Team A.C.T. assembly that focuses on service and making a difference. Players will discuss the importance of teamwork and how **A**ccountability, **C**hoices and **T**rust

can make their community a better place.

In the afternoon, NASA will join the Astros to plant trees as part of the team's ongoing Play Green® program. Astros employees, players and NASA Astronauts will plant 31 trees at Sylvan Rodriguez Park in Clear Lake. The 31 trees represent the number of Astros home runs hit at Minute Maid Park last August and September, bringing the total number of trees planted by the club to 80 – one for each Astros home run hit at home in 2009. Sylvan Rodriguez Park is a Houston Parks and Recreation Department park named for former news anchor and NASA champion Sylvan Rodriguez.

According to NASA's Chief Scientist for Earth Observations for Human Exploration, Dr. Kamlesh Lulla, "Trees are nature's engineering marvel. They absorb huge amounts of carbon dioxide and produce oxygen, thus mitigating the impacts of green house effect. NASA satellites and scientists are actively monitoring the health of our planet and are involved in understanding the greenhouse effect and other climate change processes on Earth's vegetated landscapes. The trees NASA is planting with the Astros will play a key role in Earth systems making our planet a unique and hospitable place for human societies and other living organisms. In short, these trees make our planet habitable and allow life to thrive here on Earth."

Houston City Council Member Mike Sullivan thanks the Astros for their commitment to tree planting. "I am particularly proud that Sylvan Rodriguez Park was chosen by the Astros," says Sullivan. "My constituents use this park on a regular basis and will always know that the Astros, NASA, and numerous volunteers worked to make our park more enjoyable for those who use it."

Additional tree planting partners include Keep Houston Beautiful, HLS Enterprises, Christison Landscape and Tree Town USA.

The Houston portion of the caravan rolls on Thursday with stops in Katy and on Friday in Sugar Land and Pearland. While caravanning through Houston, the Astros will simultaneously have a second caravan making a three-day trip through the Temple area (Jan. 18-20). The caravan's second week will tour central and southern Texas (Jan. 25-28), including stops in Waco, Round Rock, Austin, San Antonio, Corpus Christi and Victoria.
